Award Information

About the Awards

The National Awards for Intercultural Excellence is a new initiative from Together For Humanity (TFH) in its mission to foster intercultural and interfaith understanding in Australian school communities.

The Awards aim to recognise students, teachers, and/or schools, from across the country, who are addressing intercultural and/or interfaith understanding within their communities.

The Award winners will be recognised at an National Award Ceremony.

Possible themes to be explored

Student or Student Team Award:

Recognises school-age student or student teams promoting, encouraging or advocating for intercultural and or interfaith understanding in areas such as the following:

- diversity and inclusion
- anti-racism
- citizenship
- human rights
- reconciliation
- community engagement

Teacher or School Team Award:

Recognises the work of either individual school teachers, teams or schools in promoting, encouraging or advocating for intercultural and/or interfaith understanding in areas such as the following:

- curriculum design or enhancement
- projects to address school community needs
- inter-school initiatives (local, national or global)
- a whole-school approach
- family and community engagement
- student leadership initiatives

Eligibility

Nominees for the student/student team award are eligible if they:

- 1. reside in Australia;
- 2. are school students enrolled in a high school in 2024

Nominees for the teacher/school team award are eligible if they:

- 1. reside in Australia (for individuals and teams);
- 2. operate in Australia (for schools);
- 3. are employed or volunteer at a recognised early learning, primary or secondary school (for individuals and teams)

How do I nominate myself, a student, student team, teacher or school team?

To nominate for the National Award please submit the following documentation:

- 1. Completed Nomination Form for either student/student team or teacher/school team
- 2. Completed Endorsement Form signed by the Principal or delegate
- 3. A three minute overview video

What are the nomination questions?

Nominees will be asked to complete a short nomination form and produce a short video outlining their initiative. In addition to this, an endorsement form must be completed by the school Principal or Manager.

Student/Student Team Award Questions

- 1. Inspiration statement: (eg: why/needs/context)
- 2. Initiative overview: (project plan/details)
- 3. Initiative goals: (objectives and intentions)
- 4. Initiative impacts: (intended outcomes, unintended outcomes, benefits evidence)

Teacher/School Team Award Questions

- 1. Inspiration statement: (why/needs/context)
- 2. Project overview: (steps/plan/project details)
- 3. Project goals: (objectives and intentions)
- 4. Project impacts: (intended outcomes, unintended outcomes, benefits, evidence, links to the Australian Professional Standards for teachers or curriculum links)

Attachments to be submitted in the final application

- 1. Competed nomination form
- 2. Completed endorsement form
- 3. Three minute overview video

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

General questions:

When are nominations due?

Nominations are due 18 March 2024

Is there an entry fee? No.

Is there a prize given to nominees?

Awards will be given to finalists and category winners.

Can I nominate myself?

Yes, you can nominate yourself.

Can I nominate a person or school anywhere in Australia?

Yes, nominees can be from anywhere in Australia.

Can I nominate any type of school?

The school must be an early learning, primary or secondary school within Australia. It is open to all school sectors.

Can I nominate a team of students?

Yes. The team of students would be nominated as part of the Student/Student Team category.

What constitutes a student team?

The student team category of the Award is a group of at least two school students working together.

What constitutes a school team?

The school team category of the Award is a group of at least two adults working together. The individuals can be teachers, non-teaching staff, members of P&C/P&F committees, members of school or early learning centre governing boards/councils.

Do I have to tell the person or school that I am nominating them?

Yes. All nominees must complete and submit a consent form which will require a signature from the individual nominee or representative of the team as well as the Principal's endorsement.

After you've submitted your nomination:

Who assesses the nominations?

Nominations are assessed by a panel consisting of staff from TFH, and their organisational partners using the nomination criteria.

When will I be notified of the outcome?

12 April 2024. All nominees will receive notification of the outcome by email.

When will the awards be presented?

Awards will be presented at an official ceremony in June/July 2024, which will be live streamed.

If I am unable to attend the ceremony, can I still receive the award?

Yes. If you cannot attend the awards ceremony, your award can either be accepted by a representative on your behalf or sent to you by mail.
