Who can participate?

Secondary schools from Queensland and Northern Territory are invited to participate. Schools will be selected to represent the diversity of Australian schools.

When and where is the Summit?

Thursday 28 August 2025 at Queensland Parliament, Brisbane.

For the first time, the Summit may go across **two days**, including **Friday 29 August.** This will be confirmed early April.

What preparation is required?

Selected schools will form teams of 4-8 students to develop a presentation / proposal on:

- building awareness of a topic related to this year's theme
- providing a solution to address an issue related to the theme

Student proposals will be presented to other participating schools, community leaders and politicians at the Summit.

What will it cost?

The Summit is a **FREE** experience. Travel costs can be subsidised.

Who is Together For Humanity?

Together For Humanity is a notfor-profit educational organisation working with school communities to combat prejudice so all young people feel they belong. We have teams in New South Wales, Queensland and Victoria, and work in partnership with The Abraham Institute in South Australia. Since 2016, our Youth Summits have hosted hundreds of students from a diverse range of government and non-government schools.
